*This report provides a summary of many arrests, incidents, events and other items of significance occurring in Bloomfield Township. ### **Summary:**

During the timeframe of June 8, 2026, through June 14, 2026, Bloomfield Township Officers handled 600 calls for service, 194 of which were traffic stops.

### **Traffic Crashes:**

Officers investigated 46 total traffic crashes during this timeframe: 24 Property Damage Crashes, 12 Personal Injury Crashes, 4 Hit and Run Crashes, 4 Private Property Crashes, 2 Car vs. Deer Crashes, and 0 Non-UD-10 Crashes.

## **Operating While Intoxicated Bloomfield Township**

### **Bloomfield Township Sees Uptick in Drunk Driving Arrests**

The Bloomfield Township Police Department has reported eight drunk driving arrests within the past seven days, raising concerns about impaired driving on local roadways.

We remind residents that driving under the influence is a completely preventable crime that puts drivers, passengers, and the public at serious risk. According to the Michigan State Police's 2024 Annual Drunk Driving Audit, there were 8,542 alcohol-involved crashes statewide, resulting in 175 alcohol-related traffic deaths and more than 4,000 injuries. Alcohol and drug impairment contributed to more than 40% of Michigan's traffic fatalities.

The Bloomfield Township Police Department encourages anyone planning to consume alcohol to arrange a safe ride home through a designated driver, rideshare service, taxi, or public transportation. The message is straightforward: if you drink, do not drive.

Officers will continue enforcement efforts aimed at keeping local roads safe and preventing impaired-driving crashes before they occur.
